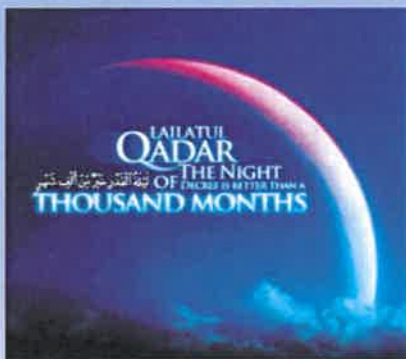

Uniform Policy

Rationale:

- A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community and assists in developing pride in representing their school. Issues of equality, health and safety, and expense are also factors that contribute to the establishment of the Dress Code.

Aims:

- To promote equality amongst all students.
- To further develop a sense of pride in, and identification with our school.
- To provide durable clothing that is cost effective and practical for our school environment.
- To maintain and enhance the positive image of the school in the community.

Implementation:

- The school has developed a 'Dress Code' that we feel allows for students to safely engage in the many varied school activities and caters for the financial constraints of families.
- The 'Dress Code' applies during school hours, while travelling to and from school and when students are on school excursions.
- Students not in full school uniform, including hats and blazers will not be permitted to attend excursions unless they have been asked to dress differently for a specific field trip.
- Summer and winter uniforms, as well as sports uniforms will be prescribed, and are required to be worn.
- Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears (female students only) plus watches are the only acceptable jewellery.
- Extreme hair colours (e.g: green, pink or purple rinses) and/or extreme hairstyles (e.g: spikes or mohawks) are not permitted.
- Other than clear nail polish, cosmetics may not be worn at school.
- The only headwear that is acceptable apart from the hijab is the school hat. Hats must be worn outside at all times.
- The student 'Dress Code' including details of uniform items and places of purchase, will be published in the newsletter at the start of each year.
- Teachers are required to enforce the uniform policy with their class.
- Students not following the uniform policy will have a uniform sticker placed in their school diary.
- If a student receives 3 stickers within one term, they will be sent to the office and their parents will be contacted to collect them from school and return them dressed in the correct uniform.

One very important occasion that was celebrated was the birth of **Imam Mahdi (atfs)** on the 15th of **Sha'baan** in the month of April. 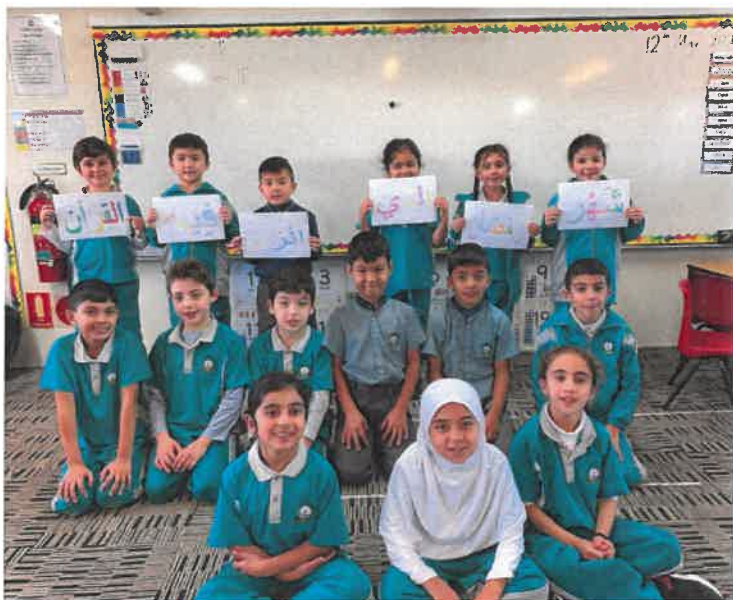

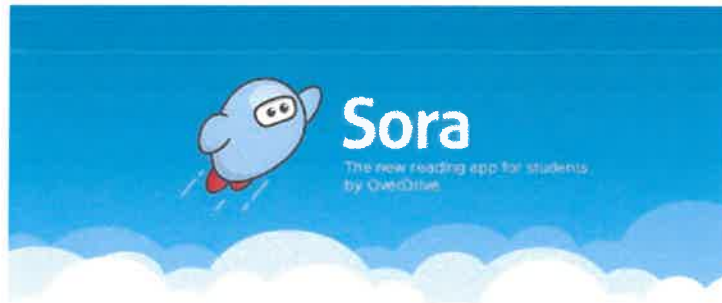


2M continue to step out into the world through the safety of their own homes by continuing to read. Remember Bellfield, even though we are at home it does not mean we cannot travel the world through books!

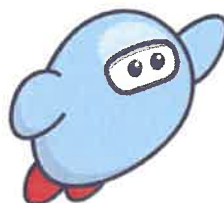
Bellfield College Library is proud to present the Sora app for students at Bellfield College!!!

Sora provides the quickest and easiest way to access digital titles from our school. Students can simply log in using school email credentials and instantly access hundreds of eBooks and audiobooks on virtually any device.

Students and staff can now log into Sora using the instructions below.

1. Go to <https://soraapp.com> or on the downloaded Sora App (available for iOS and Android)
2. Choose "find my school" and type in Bellfield College or type the school postcode (2557).
3. Sign in using school email credentials
4. Tap on the Explore tab to search for and borrow a book. Your book will open so you can start reading or listening right away.
5. You can borrow a book for 14 days. You can borrow up to 4 books at a time. You can place holds on books that are checked out.
6. Go to your Shelf to read or listen to any books you have borrowed.
7. Tap Options to renew or return the book, get to your notes and highlights, and more.
