
We have practiced how to read the text together in Arabic and the students did amazing job.

In Illuminations in year 1 this term, we are focusing on the story of our beloved Prophet Mohammad (swas).


We have learned the importance of reciting Salawat and have been encouraging students to recite salawat and remember the Holy Prophet as often as we can.

"A person is either your brother in faith or equal in humanity"



2020 has been a difficult year for so many reasons and now more than ever it is important that we are united. With the controversy surrounding race in the news 5P students have been celebrating their cultural diversity and embracing who they are.
