If the matter needs further attention, the following lines should be followed:




Scholastic Book Club

At the College we want all our students to wear their uniform with pride. This means being well presented at all times. Student uniforms must be clean and neatly pressed. Please remember that as Australian Muslims, we are representatives of Allah (swt) and his blessed message. It is therefore essential that we ensure both our children and their family members take care in their presentation. As an independent private school we strive to think, act and look professional. This is a representation of the College and must be adhered to at all times Uniforms can be purchased at the College Uniform shop.

The uniform dress code applies during school hours, while travelling to and from school and when students are on school excursions. Students not in full school uniform, including hats and blazers will not be permitted to attend excursions unless they have been asked to dress differently for a specific field trip.

- · Students not following the uniform policy will have a uniform sticker placed in their student diary.
- If a student receives 3 stickers within one term, they will be referred to a member of the Junior School Executive team for parent follow up.

Bellfield College uniform includes:

School Shoes


- Black leather shoes are compulsory in both Junior and Senior campus. Example brands include; Clarks, Colorado, Rock, Hush Puppies etc.
- Students are not allowed to wear leather Converse, Nike, Adidas or any other sports brands that are made of soft leather
- Sports shoes/sneakers may be worn on designated sports and PE days only.

Hats and Headwear

- Female students from Year 4 and up must wear a hijab and correct long-sleeved shirt and full-length dress. Hijabs must be two piece white (no off-white, lace or beading), ironed and neat.
- The only headwear that is acceptable apart from the hijab is the College hat or cap.
- Soft brim hats for boys & girls (K 3)
- Caps permitted for boys & girls (Yrs 4 12)
- · College hats must be worn outside at all times. Hats are not worn inside.
- Both caps and hats with a soft brim are available for purchase from the Uniform Shop. No other hats or caps are permitted.

Hair

- · Hair must be kept off the face.
- Hair which is longer than the shoulders must be tied up using white or natural hair colour ties/headbands/clips.
- Hair colour must be of a natural tone and cut at a reasonable length. Extreme hair colours (e.g.: green, pink or purple rinses) are not permitted.
- Extreme hairstyles (e.g.: mullets, close shaves, rats tails, shaved lines, spikes or mohawks) are not permitted.



- · Girls are to wear plain grey tights (not leggings and/or socks) in winter. Coloured leggings and socks are not allowed.
- · Plain white socks are worn in summer only.









Makeup and Jewellery:

- Accessories (such as bangles, necklaces or rings), nail polish, earrings or nose rings are unacceptable.
- Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears (female students only) and watches are the only acceptable jewellery.
- · Smart watches must have Wifi and messaging capability disabled during school hours.
- . Other than clear nail polish, makeup may not be worn at school.

Female students are not permitted to shorten their sports uniform tops, unless (in some cases) it falls below the knee. These sport tops have been especially designed to meet the dress code of the College and must not be altered. Boys' uniforms must also be stain-free and neatly pressed. Torn clothing should be attended to at the earliest convenience.





Usernames and Passwords will be given to all students once the challenge is open and myself as well as the teaching team will be here to support all students through the challenge.


